PROVISIONS ON MUTUAL DUTIES AND RIGHTS OF TEACHING STAFF AND STUDENTS

APPROVED In LiepU Senate meeting, February 21, 2011, protocol No 8, decision No 2011/18

Issued according to clause 2.4. of Liepaja University Constitution

Provisions regulate mutual duties and rights of teaching staff and students in the acquisition of a study course

I. DUTIES AND RIGHTS OF TEACHING STAFF

1. Duties of teaching staff,

commencing study course/module,

- 1.1. to issue to students of a teaching group a study course/module programme (at least one copy), in which the topics, literature, forms of work (lectures, seminars, independent works, etc.), tests and other timing of test forms are indicated;
- 1.2. to set out in details the requirements and evaluation criteria;
- 1.3. to agree, if necessary, regarding changes in the programme of study course/module or in the performance of independent works.

during the study course/module:

- 1.4. to implement the study course/module programme creatively and responsibly;
- 1.5. to diversify the study process using a variety of working methods (lectures, seminars, learning of individual topic, project method, etc.) according to the specifics of the course/module;
- 1.6. to provide consultations in accordance with the specified time;
- 1.7. to promote the scientific and professional competence of students;
- 1.8. to inform students of the absence in lectures in accordance with the procedures specified in the university;

1.9. to agree with the dean/vice-dean regarding the re-working of classes, to inform students (except in cases of disease).

finishing study course/module,

- 1.9. to receive the examination protocol in the Study department, to return it after the examination;
- 1.10. to accept a student for the completion of an examination, only if a personal identification document or a student's certificate is presented;

1.11. to evaluate the work of each student, justifying the assessment;

1.12. determining plagiarism in works submitted by students, not to evaluate it positively; to inform the dean about plagiarism in writing.

<u>Rights of teaching staff,</u>

commencing study course/module,

1.13. to make changes in the programme of a study course/module, to approve them together with students;

1.14. to develop evaluation criteria.

during the study course/module:

1.15. to require students to acquire the programme of a course/module;

1.16. to require students to comply with the plan for the performance of their independent works;

1.17. to require students to attend classes.

evaluating students' work,

1.18. to take into account the work of students during the semester;

1.19. to expel from the examination or to reduce the mark, if unauthorised means are utilised during the examination.

II. DUTIES AND RIGHTS OF STUDENTS

2. Duties of students,

commencing study course/module,

2.1. to familiarise with the programme of a study course/module and to comply with the requirements thereof;

2.2. to clarify unclear matters, if necessary;

2.3. to agree on an individual work schedule, if necessary;

2.4. to offer, if necessary, changes to the programme of a study course/module.

during the study course/module:

2.1. to acquire the issues in the programme of a study course/module creatively and responsibly;

2.2. to comply with the plan for the performance of independent works specified by the teaching staff;

2.3. to take up missed lessons independently;

2.4. not to submit plagiarism.

finishing study course/module,

2.1. to pass the examination at the specified times;

2.2. to present a personal identification document or a student certificate to the teaching staff upon arrival for the examination.

Rights of students,

commencing study course/module,

2.1. to receive a programme of a study course/module;

- 2.2. to find out the requirements and evaluation criteria of the teaching staff;
- 2.3. in individual cases to work on an individual schedule by agreeing with the teaching staff;
- 2.4. to propose changes for the programme of a study course/module, if necessary.

during the study course/module:

2.1. to require the teaching staff to use different methods in the study process in accordance with the specifics of the course/module;

2.2. to turn to the relevant departments in case of claims (decanate, Study department, rectorate, Study Council);

2.3. to attend consultations at the time specified by the teaching staff;

2.4. to require that the lessons that have not taken place would be re-worked.

finishing study course,

2.2. to receive assessment and its justification thereof;

2.3. to appeal for an assessment within one day after the notification of the examination or results in the decanate;

2.4. to ask to allow the examination to be carried out by the commission.

The provisions on mutual duties and rights of teaching staff and students shall enter into force on 21 February 2011.

Provisions on mutual duties and rights of teaching staff and students approved by the Senate on 19 May 2003 shall cease to be valid.
